PUBLIC CALL (EDITAL) #029/2024

Number of vacancies and areas of knowledge:

- 1 (one) on Economics; with emphasis on: Macroeconomics and Socioeconomic Development

Areas of knowledge to be contemplated:

Macroeconomics and Socioeconomic Development

Requirements:

- I – any Doctoral Degree obtained for at least 2 (two) years;
- II – Physical and mental health for the job;
- III – Other documents required (UFABC will intermediate visa process for foreigners)

Remuneration and term of employment:

❖ R\$ 10.481,64 monthly per 40 weekly hours of work for one year, annually extensible up to 4 (four) years for foreigners

Required documents and application:

- I – any Doctoral Degree
- II – Curriculum vitae or generated on <http://lattes.cnpq.br/>
- III - List of the items of the curriculum presented for the Title Test provided for in item 7.2, according to the model available in the Selection Process section of the website www.ufabc.edu.br
- IV – Curriculum items supporting documents such as published articles, book chapters, certificates etc. (check curriculum analysis chart on the appendix)
- V - research project and/or work plan, referenced and contextualized to the special program, area of knowledge of option and to the Pedagogical Project of UFABC, **with a maximum of twelve (12) pages**

Detailed characteristics of the vacancy:

Special Teaching, Research or Outreach program:

The role of the visiting professor should strengthen teaching, extension, and research activities at both the undergraduate and graduate levels in the field of Economics, specifically in the subfield of Macroeconomics and Economic Development. The professor should integrate into established groups within the institution, expanding the research lines currently

addressed and enhancing the institution's interface with society. This aims to increase the number of students served by the undergraduate and graduate programs and develop new methodologies applied to this area and subfield of the special teaching, research, and extension program.

It is also expected that involvement in extension activities and the establishment of partnerships with various sectors of civil society will contribute to the strengthening and promotion of the course.

The BCE maintains a regular offering of required courses, limited option courses, and elective courses.

Additionally, BCE faculty also offer courses in interdisciplinary programs. Thus, the visiting professor will contribute to the regular offering of required, limited option, and elective courses, as well as contribute to UFABC's graduate programs and participate in extension activities, facilitating the exchange of knowledge and practices.

The visiting professor will contribute to the teaching, research, and extension axes within the BCE as follows:

(I) Teaching: The Visiting Professor will teach courses in the Interdisciplinary Bachelor's Programs (BCH and BCT) and in the BCE at UFABC. In the Bachelor's in Economics, the Visiting Professor will teach not only but especially courses related to the subareas of the Selection Process. Regarding the Interdisciplinary programs, faculty members are expected to assist in various courses, such as Technology and Society, Introduction to Economics, and Introduction to Economic Thought, among others. Additionally, if requested by the BCE Coordination, they may also contribute by offering Limited Option courses.

(II) Research and Postgraduate Studies: Depending on their area of expertise and research, the Visiting Professor should engage in courses within UFABC's postgraduate programs, as well as participate in supervision and research activities in collaboration with established research groups at the University.

Among UFABC's Postgraduate Programs, the Visiting Professor may be involved in PPGE, PPG-EPM, PPG-CHS, and others, depending on their scientific affiliations. Visiting professors should also assist in implementing new research lines at UFABC.

(III) Extension: The Visiting Professor should help the BCE in carrying out extension activities. Extension activities may include: 1) promoting transformative and dialogic interaction between the University and society through interdisciplinary, educational, cultural, scientific, and/or political processes, under the constitutional principle of the inseparability of extension, teaching, and research; 2) scientific dissemination through the promotion of meetings that facilitate public and high-quality discussions on socially relevant topics; 3) fostering greater interface with the productive sector; 4) participating in discussions and in the Working Group

on the curricularization process of extension in the BCE; 5) assuming extension courses in the Interdisciplinary and BCE programs.

Furthermore: Part of the Visiting Professor's activities may take place through the UFABC Innovation Agency, Strategic Nuclei, and the University's Research Nuclei and Groups. The Visiting Professor should have the availability and interest to engage in research groups, working groups, and committees organized by the BCE.
